# School News - February 2022



#### CLASS 1

This term our topic is 'Farming' and we have begun by exploring how we get food and where it comes from finding out that not all the food we eat, such as pineapples, do not grow in the UK. We have looked at where various foods grow and how we get these foods not grown in the UK transported to us.

Within the food topic we have looked at animals we may find on a farm and why farmers have them; what do they provide us with? The children have found out



what we can get from certain animals, and that some produce, such as milk, can then be turned into other products such as cheese. In history next half term we are going to look how farming has changed over the years and we are hoping to organise a visit to Easton Farm Park later on in the Spring Term.

Alongside this the children have been learning about Self-portraits in art and focusing their work on Picasso. Children in Class 1 have been learning about Pablo Picasso in their art lessons. They had a go at designing their own surreal portrait in a similar style with some great results. Picasso photo

The children have been learning how to use a computer. Year 1/2 have been working on Purple Mash developing our skills of using a mouse and navigating the computer using this. They have created their own stories, which include drawings and writing. We extended our stories by adding in sound and animation. The reception children have been playing games, colouring in and drawing pictures using touch screen equipment. The children then moved onto creating their own stories using the touch screen equipment and they too have added in animation and sound to their stories.

In Thursday PE the children have been learning about defending and working together as a team. The children have played various games to develop defence strategies and have made really good progress in their individual skills and team work. On a Friday afternoon the children have been learning about dance. The children have learnt to sequence movements together, some more difficult than others, and to perform it to their peers.

On Friday 4<sup>th</sup> February the whole school had a maths morning. In Class 1 we learnt about symmetry and made our own butterflies to create a symmetrical pattern on each wing. The children thoroughly enjoyed this. Alongside our maths morning the children practised their times tables using TT Rockstars and had a competition between each other. We had a really fun morning.

We are really looking forward to next half term.

## CLASS 2

Class 2 have had a great start to 2022. We began by planning and writing our very own stories based on The Three Little Pigs and The Big bad Wolf. The children were very imaginative in their thinking coming up with characters from sharks to sheep dogs! They wrote their stories and presented them beautifully as proper books with chapters.

We are enjoying reading The BFG by Roald Dahl. We have written some super descriptive recounts of the opening chapter and will be using the story next term to write newspaper reports.

In maths we have been getting to grips with fractions and using our tables and division facts to help us calculate fractions of quantities. We have explored the way in which equivalent fractions are generated and found some interesting patterns. TT

Rockstars is really helping to embed all the times tables we have been learning since September.

In our history lessons we have been learning about the Stone Age. We began by making a timeline to set this period into the wider context of British history and looked at how it is subdivided into distinct ages. We looked at how hunter gatherers survived in Stone Age Britain by using assets provided by their natural environment. We also explored the style of Stone Age cave art and had a go at drawing some of the animals using similar techniques.

We took a virtual tour around Stonehenge and explored different theories about how and why it was built. We then used a plan of Stonehenge to reconstruct it using coloured blocks. Finally, we used a torch to illustrate the


sun as it rises and casts shadows either side of the stones. It was great fun!

We are all very excited to be performing at Snape Maltings on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> March and hope that as many of you can come and watch as possible. Keep practising those songs!

## CLASS 3

Class 3 have had a busy half term and I've been so proud of how they've all coped during the changes of the past few weeks.

In maths we've been getting to grips with fractions and their relation to decimals and percentages. We still have a bit more to do after half term before moving on to measurement and geometry.

In history, pupils have been learning about the Titanic and how the disaster has influenced changes to travelling on the sea now. The pupils have really engaged with this topic and enjoyed learning about it.

In literacy we have written our own short stories — there are some very impressive writers among the children! We have also been looking at the art of persuasion and how to write our own persuasive information leaflet about the city of Paris. Next term we will be looking at what it's like to live in Norway and use this information to write a letter to a friend describing what it is like. Sticking to the holiday theme, we will be imagining what horrors could happen on holiday and write a formal letter of complaint about it!



In music the children have been working hard learning their songs for Snape and we are looking forward to sharing this experience with the children's families on 8<sup>th</sup> March.

Our science lessons have involved looking at how we can help endangered species and what we can do to reduce our impact on the environment. After the half term, we will be looking further into evolution and features we inherit from our parents and ancestors.

Class 3 have been given a little bit of homework for the half term holidays (spellings, TT Rockstars, reading for the reading challenge and free writing) and I look forward to seeing them after the break.
