School News – December 2021

CLASS 1

What a wonderful half term we have had. The children have continued with their hard work and enjoyed deepening their understanding of place value, shape and addition and subtraction. In literacy the children have written firework poetry, followed and written instructions and have written their own story based on Leafman.



The children enjoyed baking for children in need and raising money. They also enjoyed learning about Bonfire night and the Gun Powder Plot and why we celebrate it. In forest school the children learnt about bonfire safety and roasted marshmallows to make S'mores. In PE the children had 4 weeks of learning how to play tri-golf, they thoroughly enjoyed this and learnt how to control the ball with the stick and develop their aim. As well as this in PE the children have been developing their hand eye co-ordination through various tasks, building the foundation blocks for sport games.

In science children have been exploring materials and their properties by conducting experiments to test various properties. The children have also found out how wool, glass and paper is made.

In recent weeks the children have been working really hard to learn their nativity lines, songs and performance. The children enjoyed going to The Wolsey theatre to watch Jack and the Beanstalk. It was great for them to see why we have performances and said they would like to do this when they are older.

CLASS 2

This half term has really flown by! Class 2 have been working very hard across all areas of the curriculum. Our literacy this term was based on a book called 'Escape from Pompeii' by Christina Balit. We have studied the text to help us write descriptively about Mount Vesuvius and the way in which it destroyed Pompeii in AD79. Using literary devices such as powerful verbs and adverbs, onomatopoeia, and expanded noun phrases, the children have written some very effective



poems about the earthquake, which preceded the eruption. They have also planned and written their own version of the story. We also had our very own Roman artefacts day.

Our guided reading book this term has been 'The 13 storey Treehouse by Andy Griffiths'. The children have really enjoyed this whacky treehouse adventure where the laugh-out-loud story is told through a combination of text and fantastic cartoon-style illustrations.

In maths, we have been getting to grips with written methods for multiplication and division and understanding the relationship between them. We are now beginning to apply these methods to a variety of word problems.

In French, we have been learning about 'Les animaux' and learning how to say our numbers to 20. We have learnt a fun song called 'Tu-as un animal?'

In their science lessons with Miss Sayer, the children have been learning about the differences between vertebrates and invertebrates. They have looked at the role of the human skeleton in protecting our vital organs and the advantages and disadvantages of different types of skeletons. They have also learnt about the importance of different food groups and the way in which they keep us healthy.

In music, we have been learning how to play the descant recorder. We have been learning how to recognise, clap and play simple 4 beat crotchet quaver rhythms .and how to recognise and play simple melodies written on the musical stave in the treble clef. Next term we will be preparing for a performance at Snape in March where the children will be learning a selection of songs focusing on our planet Earth. More details to follow in the New Year!

During their time there, they had to solve the mystery of who stole the silver candlesticks by interacting with the various characters throughout the day. Most of them got it right, so we may have some budding detectives in the making!

From our visit we were then able to imagine that we were living in the workhouse and wrote diary entries based upon our experience. Life in the workhouse was very hard and if you didn't like gruel, then it would be much harder!

In maths we have been getting to grips with fractions and will continue with these after Christmas. During the holidays the pupils can play a few games of TT Rockstars to help them remember their times tables.

Our Science lessons have involved finding out about electricity and we have been making our own circuits and experimenting with making bulbs brighter and buzzers louder! We also had a go at making our own steady hand game, which was great fun!

In music with Mrs Merry pupils have been learning to play the recorder and read music. There has been lots of beautiful singing too!

Although this term has been a challenging one, the pupils have coped brilliantly. Thank you to all parents for their support this term. I hope you all have an enjoyable Christmas with your family and loved ones. See you all in January.

What a busy term the children have had. I am really pleased that the staff have managed to get the children out on numerous trips and visits and their experiences have been reflected in the wonderful work produced. I am also extremely happy that, at the time of writing, the school has not had to take additional precautions due to COVID-19. I have seen first-hand how disruptive a COVID outbreak can

be in a school and the affects it can have upon the well-being of pupils, parents, and staff. 
