CLASS 1

Well, what a term Class One have had, we can't believe we are sat here writing this end of Spring term newsletter piece, this term has flown by.

The children have continued to work really hard, learning how to tell the time, fractions, shapes, writing sense and shape poems and writing a story based on farming. In foundation subjects the children have learnt about light and where it comes from, knowing some light is natural whereas some is man-made. The children explored light by making shadow puppets in the sun; the children really enjoyed this.

This term the children have started weekly swimming lessons. In the short time they have been swimming they have all made excellent progress. The children have a further 9 weeks swimming next term.

On 30th March the children went to Easton Farm Park. The children had a very enjoyable visit, which cemented their learning about 'farming and food'. The children started off with a model cow and learnt about how to milk a cow many years ago compared to the modern day. All the children had a go at milking the cow and at making butter, by shaking the milk in a jar. The children soon realised how hard work it was and stopped before it became butter. The children did make some very thick cream. They were enthralled with their creations!

In history the children have been learning about how farming has changed, and how farming used to be done. The children have learnt about the Suffolk Punch horse and how it helped farming in the past. At the park the children enjoyed getting up close to Lily the Suffolk Punch. The children were amazed at her size and got a true understanding of how these powerful creatures helped farming.

We have lots of exciting things coming up next term and we can't wait to tell you all!

CLASS 2

Class 2 have had an extremely busy second half to our spring term.

The highlight of this term was singing at Snape Maltings where we performed in the main concert hall in front of a huge audience.

The performance included songs about the importance of recycling and how we can make the World a better place. Between each song, children recited poems highlighting their concerns about the world in which they live. We also participated in a gamelan workshop where we were given the rare opportunity to play some beautiful metallophones and some huge gongs. At the end of the concert we joined with several other schools to perform the finale song 'Find your Light'.

Parents praised the clarity and confidence of their singing. Mrs Merry and Mrs Reeve were immensely proud of all the children who took part.

In maths we have been focusing on measurement. We have learnt how to measure length accurately in mm and cm and how to convert between different units. We have also been learning how to add and subtract money in pounds and pence including how to calculate the correct change from larger amounts.

In literacy, we have been busy learning about the features of news reports. We have written a report based on the kidnap of Sophie Dahl by the BFG and her brave escape by jumping into the local duck pond! The children enjoyed being news reporters interviewing a variety of witnesses about what happened. They used some of their quotes in their stories.

In geography, we have been using google maps to locate cities and towns in North and South America. We have learnt about the 16 point compass and how to use it to describe position on a map. We are using the internet to research about the characteristics of a specific city and its environment and then make comparisons with others.



In Science, we have been learning about 'Forces and Magnets'. We started off by understanding what a force was and where it was first thought about with Sir Issac Newton. We then went on to look at force meters and continued with experimenting using different materials on a ramp to send a car down, we measured the distance it travelled and discussed our findings, talking lots about the amount of friction something may create depending on the surface it is on. We then explored magnets and what might be magnetic or non-magnetic, we



found it fascinating how magnets attract and repel each other and the force different magnets have.

CLASS 3

Class Three News

This has been a really busy term for class 3 and they are all ready for a break, as are Mrs Crane and I!

In our Literacy we have been studying informal and formal letter writing, noting the differences between the two. We have used our work from our geography topic to imagine that we had moved to Norway and we wrote an informal letter to a friend, describing what it was like to live in Norway. Hopefully they will be able to tell you some interesting facts about what Norway is like in June! We have been sharing a wonderful book by Anthony Horowitz called The French Confection where two brothers, Nick and Tim Diamond, win a holiday in Paris where everything goes wrong from the moment they board the Eurostar! We imagined that we were Tim and wrote a letter of complaint about the terrible holiday experience; from poor room service to being chased by the locals!

In geography, as well as learning about Norway, we have been learning about the Alps and how mountains are formed over millions of years. The pupils had great fun making their own mountains from salt dough!

In maths we have been revising our written methods for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division as well as recapping our fraction, decimal and percentage knowledge. Pupils have learned about perimeter, area and converting between measures. We have looked at imperial and metric measures and converting between those. Next term we will be learning about angles; how to measure and calculate them.

In computing we are learning how to make our own 3D maze games complete with baddies chasing us! We look forward to finishing these off next term and the children being able to share these with you at home on their Purple Mash learning platform.

For our science topic this term we have enjoyed learning about how different animals and plants adapt to suit their environments and why they must adapt to survive. We also enjoyed sharing family photos and creating our own family trees. Thank you so much for sending the children into school with their family photos – the children had great fun discussing their relatives and spotting likenesses!

READING CHALLENGE AND LIBRARY UPDATE



We are pleased to announce that the library re-fit is almost complete with a few things still needing to be sorted. It has been a real pleasure to hear the squeals of delight when pupils go into the library to choose their books! We are going to be appointing library monitors and all children will have the opportunity to go into the library, on a weekly basis, to chose a book to read/share at



home. We have a system set up, where the book choices will be recorded electronically and written in a library record book, so we can track the books the children are choosing.

We've been so pleased with the amount of reading taking place for the Reading Challenge, so far, even staff are joining in marking off any reading they do at home too. The enthusiasm that the children are showing towards their reading is fantastic and we have got children reaching 100 reads already.

Thank-you so much for your support in listening to the children read at home, it makes a huge difference to their progress. Did you know that listening to your child read and reading to your child has many benefits? Some benefits include: an increase in fluency, it can help to improve concentration, improve vocabulary, help to strengthen the understanding between spoken and written language, helps to strengthen skills in writing and provides enjoyment.



Any reading can be included in the Reading Challenge, could we please remind you to record whatever you are able to do in your child's Jungle Reading Record (Class 1) or Yellow Reading Record (Class 2 and 3), as we have children telling us they have read, but not having it marked in their record books.
