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# School News - May 2021



#### Class 1

It has been so nice to have everyone back for this term to learn about our new topic 'Transport and Machines'. The children all settled into school straight away as if they had never been away. Through our topic, we have learnt about various inventors, such as Thomas Edison and George Stephenson and found out how their inventions have shaped our past and will continue to shape our future. In science, we have been busy



learning about electrical safety, how electricity is made and what different types we can have to power items (battery or mains). The children have really enjoyed learning about this and next term we will continue with making and testing circuits and creating our own buzz wire game.

This term, we have been focusing on improving our handwriting; the children have made good progress with this. The Reception and Year 1 children have been strengthening their hands to improve their pencil and scissor control. The Year 2's have been focusing on making sure their letters are of the correct size to one another and some have begun to join their letters. The children have been practising their new skills in every piece of writing. Their work is looking really smart now and we are very proud of what they are producing. In literacy the children have been broadening their vocabulary word bank through describing characters, settings etc. We have then applied this new knowledge into writing stories from different settings. The children have produced some excellent pieces of writing.

In maths the children have been learning the days of the week, months of the year and learning to tell the time on a clock. Reception and Year 1 children know how to tell the time to the hour and half past and Year 2 children to every 5 minutes. We will continue to practise telling the time next half term to make sure the children are secure on this. It would be great if they could tell you the time at home; some children can even work out how long it will be until a certain time. For the last few weeks of this half term they have begun to learn about money. The children know all the coins and their values and have begun to recognise how much money they have in a piggy bank or how to find the right amount of money to buy an item.

This term the children have started swimming again - they have all been fantastic and shown a lot of progress in the few weeks we have been going. Last week when the Year 5 and 6 went off to Hilltop, Class 1 were so excited to hear of their challenges that they enjoyed a Hilltop adventure themes Forest Schools. They had various activities such as a tunnel, laser quest, climbing etc.

We hope that you all enjoyed your Half Term break – Miss Sayer and Mrs Smith







#### <u>Class 3</u>

Class 3 have been really busy this term learning all about Tudor life and why Henry VIII had so many wives! The children produced beautiful information pages about Henry's wives and what happened to them. Sadly two lost their heads, two were divorced (he thought one looked like a horse!), and one died. His last wife was the lucky one who outlived Henry, although sadly she died only a year later. We have also been learning about the fate of the Priests during the dissolution of the monasteries during Henry VIII's and Edward VI's reign and will continue with this after the half term break.

In Science we have learned all about what it's like to live with no gravity and how astronauts complete everyday tasks that we take for granted such as cleaning our teeth, eating a meal and washing our hair! Pupils have enjoyed this topic and are looking forward to learning about forces next half term.

In maths we have been looking at finding the perimeter and area of shapes. The children have also studied statistics and finding the average of a set of data as well as learning to read timetables and graphs showing various different information. We have also recapped our written methods and next half term will be looking at geometry, position and direction and ratio.

The first excitement of the term is that I've shared the KS 2 play with the children. We are going to be performing "Treasure Island" in July (hopefully to a live audience this year. We will keep you updated with this). The children will be coming home with a script, so it would be really helpful if you could help them learn their lines and develop a pirate accent "*Arrrh*!" during the half term break please.

The highlight of the term has to be our residential visit Hilltop! The children were brilliant and they challenged themselves whilst supporting their friends complete the activities. Hilltop is an



outdoor adventure site set in woodland near Sheringham in Norfolk, and the activities offered encourage the children to challenge themselves to tackle activities that they wouldn't normally be able to do in the classroom. Just a few of the activities we took part in were: climbing wall, zip wire, jumping off a platform onto an inflatable air bag (Air Jump), assault course, mountain biking and Tree Top Trail (an adventurous course through the trees at various different heights and level of challenge). Of course, I mustn't forget the all-important Tuck Shop, which the children have to run themselves, adding up the total cost of goods, operating the till and working out the correct change to give to their customers! I can honestly say that this has been the best group I've taken to



Hilltop; all the children supported each other, realised that their challenges were different to each other's and celebrated everyone's achievements. The instructors commented that they were the best group they'd had too! I am super proud of them all and it was a delight to take them. This week we have been making scrap books of our Hilltop memories to keep and share with our families. A big thank-you to Mrs Smith and Miss Sayer who gave up their time to come along and help on this trip.

#### Class 2



Children in Class 2 have been very busy this term: We have been learning about the water cycle and the journey of a river as it meanders across the land from its source in the mountains to its mouth at the sea. We learnt about the processes of erosion and deposition which result in the formation of river features such as waterfalls, meanders, oxbow lakes and deltas. We then used our knowledge to design an information poster to include a number of those features.

In literacy we planned and wrote stories based on Stick Man by Julia Donaldson. The children produced some great narrative describing what happened to Stick Man as he met different characters along the river, how he felt as he travelled further away from his family tree and finally how he managed to get back home.

In maths the children have been working on telling the time digitally using am and pm and as a 24 hour clock time. We realised that telling the time in all its many different ways, including analogue time, can be quite tricky! We are coming on in leaps and bounds with our times tables and I'm pleased to report that we have now covered all our tables right up to the twelves!

In French the children have learnt to sing a song about the weather. They have learnt about some of the major cities and areas in France and what they are famous for. We have looked at countries that border France and located natural features such as rivers and mountain ranges.

We are now embarking on a new topic: Children now and in the past. We will be looking at toys from the past and would love to see any old fashioned toys parents or grandparents would be willing to send into school this half term.
