CLASS THREE



Class 3 have worked incredibly hard this term learning all about the Tudor period. We have studied Shakespeare's Hamlet and have written a short narrative based upon one of the scenes in the play. Some pupils even managed to include some dialogue from the script. The children also learned about the Spanish Armada in preparation for when we travelled back in time to Tudor England (1588) at Kentwell Hall for the day. In order to be allowed in we had to tell the Gate Keeper how Charsfield was prepared to defend the country should the Ar-



mada get through! The children were fully immersed in the activities and interacted with the characters in a mature and sensible manner.



We were also lucky enough to be able to visit the Tower of London and see where Sir Walter Raleigh spent much of his time before being executed as a traitor! For some pupils it was their first time on the London Underground - I think some of them were shocked by how big it is!



We spent a day at Framlingham College taking part in some Maths problems – some very puzzling ones! The children also had a DT lesson where they made a rocket and a keyring. We had great fun with an air compressor seeing how far the rockets could fly. Finally, we took part in

a robot programming lesson where the pupils had to use the computer to programme the robot around a course. We had a fantastic day and are grateful to the college for offering us the opportunity to take part.

Year 5 spent a day at Thomas Mills High School using Bunsen burners in the science labs and making magic wands in DT. This was all linked to a project that the high school run for a day based upon Harry Potter! The children were extremely well behaved and had a thoroughly enjoyable day. Well done!
